The Board of Directors meeting was called to order at 1:00pm with the State Coordinator Mike Myers leading in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mike explained that the chapters who were given the blue cards were allowed to speak, but could not vote because the 990 requirement had not been met.

Approval of the minutes:

Changes were read by Kat Conner to correct the draft minutes. Included Guest list, change Beaucoup Bottoms from absent to present, page 6, Southwest Region report, chapter listed as Shawnee Hills should be Shoal Creek. Motion made by Heart of Illinois to approve minutes as corrected, Freedom by Choice 2nd, no discussion, motion passed.

Unfinished Business:

Products Trailer: Terry & Mick are still in the process of finding the correct type of trailer needed.

<u>Swap Meet:</u> Motion by Southern Illinois, Heartland 2nd to not buy the Thunder Alley Swap Meet, discussion, Crossroads call the question, Freedom by Choice 2nd, Opposed to call the question: Midstate, motion to call the question carried. Motion to not buy carried. Opposed: Kaskaskia Valley, Midstate. BOD2011-1

Discussion points included the swap meet would be a lot of work for a few people, felt there were discrimination issues, not comfortable with the terms of non competition for only five years, not seeing the actual bookkeeping records.

<u>Waiver form:</u> Mike Myers made the following points: 1. The current waiver forms will stay the same until/unless the BOD wants to make a change. 2. ABATE does NOT check Driver's Licenses. He would like to encourage you to

not let people sign into an event with a fictitious name such as Mickey Mouse. 3. ABATE does not check to see if you have an M classification.

Mike had asked Rod Taylor to attend today's meeting to discuss the waiver, but he had another commitment. He did tell the BOD that the E board recommended we keep the current waiver. Motion by Blackhawk, Freeport 2nd that the BOD accept the E Board recommendation to keep the current waiver, motion carried. Opposed: Iron Riders, Midstate. BOD 2011-2

Motion made by Southern Dupage to close Unfinished Business, LincolnLand 2nd, no discussion, motion passed.

Officer's Reports:

<u>Legislative</u>: Bob Myers reports that Todd Vandermyde, our paid lobbyist, has changed his business name so his contract will have to be changed to reflect that, then the BOD will have to approve it. ABATE is working with Judy Barr-Topinka and Dan Rutherford to protect our CRT funds. Since the lawsuit is still being decided, our current funds will probably be left alone.

Bob discussed the Flower's bills, HB285, 290 & 292 have currently been pulled, but will bear watching. He will send out Ondgo alerts when SB 55 & 57 come up. He urges members to come to the capitol when hearings are set. He would like us to support SB1291- ABATE year round license plates when the time comes. He would like the BOD to look over the MRF Legislative Agenda and consider changing ours to include more of the MRF's. He discussed other state government's who have raided or done away with their CRT funds. At the Federal level, HR412 needs more cosigners for the Kids Just Want to Ride. The Washington, D.C. trip is set for April 3-9. Going are: Ray Heck, Rick "RO" Olson, Cindy Lannom, Deb King, Pauli Ward, Jackie Spivey, Denny Lange, and John "Hunter John" Harris. He would like to have two more people.

Legislative Day is March 2, 9 am at the Statehouse Inn/Governor's Ballroom. Bob asked that Regional Coordinators make sure to get updated legislative rep's information to him. Some elected officials have changed, please send those who supported us a thank you. He encourages all members to visit their US Congressmen when they are home.

Motion by Blackhawk, Heart of Illinois 2nd, have the BOD allow Bob Myers and Ernie Steele (webmaster) to compile a publishable legislative agenda, motion carried. Opposed: Midstate. BOD2011-3

Freedom by Choice recognized Pauli Ward. She states all chapters are certified as bona fide civic organizations so members can be voter registrars and she encourages at least one per county do so.

Safety & Education:

Thirty three chapters were represented at the Safety & Ed workshop at the state seminar. Laura reported on fatalities, ages involved, registration of motorcycles, and other factors. The CRT program seems to be standing on its own at last.

Activities:

The Springfield Swap meet is Feb. 20th at 10 am. The Awareness Rally can use the IDOT facilities. Bands are booked for the State party, other work is progressing on it.

Bike Raffle:

Gus reiterated that he will not be taking the bike to many events.

State Office:

Black Diamond and Peo-Taz need to pay their seminar fees. She needs officer updates ASAP. Seminar Awards were handed out to chapters not at the seminar. A question was raised on how long to keep records; 7 years was the consensus. Big Rivers donated to the general fund.

Advance state party tickets are available today.

Public Relations:

The billboard company is working on the design, it will cost \$375.00 for 30 days through Outdoor Advertising of Illinois.

Products:

Awareness Rally and State party shirts will be available.

Treasurer:

Julie Bacon reports that the chapters did much better this year with the 990 forms! We had \$50,000 left in our budget at the end of the year, so officers held expenses down well in 2010. She suggested that Public Relations do the promotional work to gain members rather than create a new position which would be costly. She noted that Rich Meyers, one of our friendly legislative members, had passed away leaving a memorial at his local university.

Motion by Midstate, Pathfinders 2nd to give \$100.00 to Rich Meyer's memorial fund, no discussion, motion carried. BOD2011-4

ABATE-PAC:

John "Hunter John" Harris thanked Thunder Rock, Freedom Riders, Open Roads, Pathfinders, Piasa-Gateway, Shoal Creek, St. Clair, Tri County, Will County, and the Northwest Region for their donations. At the seminar, donations were received from Freebird, Liberty, Northern Illinois, Freedom Riders, Freedom Valley, LincolnLand, Peo-Taz, Heart of Illinois, and Midstate. They will start rotating the fundraising nights at the State Seminar in the future. There will be PAC shirts at the Awareness Rally.
